Commencement of redevelopment works at Footscray Wharf

Port of Melbourne Corporation (PoMC) will shortly commence works to redevelop Footscray Wharf at Maribyrnong Street, Footscray into a new commercial mooring facility for port vessels.

Initial works will commence in the next week and will involve:

- Erection of temporary site cabins
- Creation of a site access point from Maribyrnong Road
- Demolition and removal of the majority of the derelict timber wharf structure
- Removal of onsite structures, utilities and pavements, and the existing mooring pontoon
- Importing rock onto site using tip trucks
- Commencement of construction of a new rock revetment along the riverbank.

Timing

In preparation for the works, contractors will access the site and import machinery to it over the coming week. Initial works are expected to commence in **June 2011** and the entire project is expected to be completed in early 2012. Works will occur between the hours of 7am and 6pm, Monday to Saturday, weather permitting.

Expected impacts

Traffic movement, noise, dust and vibration may be experienced. The contractor is required to minimise impacts at all times. All works must meet strict environmental requirements.

Access

Construction vehicles will access the site via Moreland Road, Parker and Maribyrnong Streets. At times during the works, signage and other traffic management measures will be placed along Maribyrnong Street and the nearby cycle and pedestrian pathways.

Cycle and pedestrian access is expected to be maintained throughout the works. We will advise you in advance should this change as works progress.

We appreciate your patience during the works, which will enable PoMC to transform the site into a useable commercial mooring facility with public access to the riverfront.
